
Achieving SDG 3 requires coordinated efforts from governments, nongovernmental organizations, healthcare institutions, and communities. The University offers a basket of core courses, electives, skill/capability enhancement courses, value addition courses, and inter-disciplinary courses in keeping with the recent advances in respective disciplines, as relevant to the programs. The curricula take into consideration the needs of environmental sustainability, community health programs, global health care issues, diseases of epidemic & pandemic potential, international health regulations, impact of climate change, mental health issues, Covid-19, occupational diseases, along with national issues like poverty, safe water, rising burden of NCDs, population explosion, gender empowerment, inadequate health infrastructure, malnutrition, tuberculosis elimination, etc, as also highlighted in the UN's 'Sustainable Development Goals'.





Healthcare Infrastructure and Services

The University is home to a super-specialty teaching hospital accredited by the National Accreditation Board for Hospitals (NABH), offering 1200 beds, including 960 teaching beds. It features AYUSH therapy centers and cutting-edge central diagnostic laboratories accredited by the National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL). These laboratories are equipped with modern, automated, high-end diagnostic equipment and a pneumatic shoot system, delivering advanced diagnostic services, as well as training and research opportunities. The hospital's diagnostic capabilities include a 1.5 Tesla MRI, 128-slice Spiral CT scan, PET scan, Gamma camera, hi-tech ultrasounds, mammography, echocardiography, cardiac catheterization labs, neurology labs, sleep labs, and endoscopic labs. These facilities provide hands-on training for medical and paramedical students.







The dedicated Cancer Centre offers comprehensive cancer care, including state-of-the-art facilities for radiotherapy and bone marrow transplants. Additionally, the institution houses a modern dialysis canter and provides facilities for renal transplants, further enhancing its capabilities in delivering specialized medical care and supporting advanced research and training.

Skill and Simulation Centre

A comprehensive medical and surgical 'Skill and Simulation Centre of Excellence (SSCE)', established by the University, is the first and only Skills & Simulation Lab in Uttarakhand, to provide state-of-the-art health care education (srhu.edu.in/mediaevents/cm-inaugurates-centre-of-excellence-in-skills-simulation-at-srhu/). SSCE has a broad range of diverse products like high-fidelity manikins, task trainers, learning models, computer-based simulators, and standardized patients. SSCE conducts regular training programs like Basic Life Support, Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support, Paediatric Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support, Neonatal Advanced Life Support, First Aid & CPR, Intensive Care Unit Procedures, Airway Management, Intravenous Access, Surgical Suturing, Trauma Management, Gynaecological & Obstetrics Procedures, Abdominal Assessment, Rectal Examination, Paracentesis, Spinal Procedures, Sonography Modules, and Basic Patient Care Procedures etc. The Skill and Simulation centre is committed to supporting and participating in offering high quality education to individuals and assisting in their preparation to be effective and compassionate health care providers in accordance with standards established nationally.

Clinical, Equipment and Laboratory Learning Resources- Himalayan Hospital

As the cornerstone of its teaching and learning methods, the university is committed to providing students with a top-notch education with a strong emphasis on practical learning. With 1200 beds and 960 teaching beds, it is a state-of-the-art tertiary-care multispecialty teaching hospital that has been properly accredited by the National Accreditation Board for Hospitals (NABH) to give students clinical experience. Furthermore, its all-inclusive cancer treatment clinic is unparalleled in service and capacity, furnished with state-of-the-art nuclear medicine, chemotherapy, radiotherapy, and surgical facilities.

The hospital has enough staff and state-of-the-art facilities to run all clinical departments around-the-clock. The hospital offers all related services as part of regulatory measures, including a Central Clinical Laboratory that has been properly accredited by the National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL), a pharmacy open 24/7, a state-of-the-art blood bank, a Central Sterilisation unit, a Medical Records section, laundry, a canteen, a Central Purchase & Store, and more.

Innovative Services: The Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences' Neonatology department created the Advanced Neonatal Transport Ambulance services to address the health issues of newborns and guarantee appropriate care and treatment while in transit. It is a creative program that can serve as a model for other establishments and help postgraduate students studying paediatrics and neonatology develop their clinical expertise.

The hospital offers a wide range of diagnostic and therapeutic services, including a 1.5 Tesla MRI, a 128-slice CT scan, high-tech ultrasounds, bone densitometry, mammography, NCV Lab, EMG, BERA, Colour Doppler, TMT, Holter, ECHO, endoscopy, bronchoscopy, cardiography, PFT, angiography, Cath lab, sleep lab, blood bank, hemo & peritoneal dialysis, bone marrow transplant facilities, radiotherapy, gamma camera, brachytherapy, PET CT scan, and bone & renal scan in the nuclear medicine unit.

Located in a dedicated four-story building, the Central Diagnostic Laboratory houses a number of labs that support investigations in the fields of haematology, clinical biochemistry, serology, virology, mycology, bacteriology, parasitology, immunology, histopathology, cytopathology, and immunohistochemistry, among others. Additionally, patients and students can easily access advanced investigations such as RT-PCR, flow cytometry, high-tech molecular lab testing, and plasma therapy for COVID-19. A special pneumatic-chute system in this structure allows blood





samples from different Himalayan Hospital wards to be transferred instantly. To support student research and education, the university also maintains a central research lab.

The hospital has received several awards and recognitions, including Ayushman Gold Certificate by the National Health Authority & Quality Council of India in appreciation and recognition of the services provided, excellence in continuous adherence with quality standards and compliance with the "Gold Quality Standards" of ABPMJAY.





Promoting Healthy Lifestyles

The University's AYUSH Learning and Therapy Centre is a distinctive facility that integrates Naturopathy, Ayurveda, Yoga, and Homeopathy clinics to promote alternative healthcare and holistic healing. These clinics not only provide quality healthcare services to the community but also expose students to diverse approaches to medical treatment, enriching their academic and practical knowledge.

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The Learning Disability Clinic (LDC) exemplifies the University's dedication to inclusive education. It collaborates with various clinical departments to offer comprehensive evaluation and support services for children with learning disorders. Through its multidisciplinary approach, the LDC ensures that children receive tailored interventions, enabling them to overcome challenges and thrive academically and socially.



Health Benefit Policy

The University has implemented a comprehensive health benefit policy to support the wellbeing of its staff and students. This policy includes health insurance coverage, regular health check-ups, and access to medical consultations at the University's teaching hospital. Special provisions are made for preventive care, vaccinations, and wellness programs to promote a healthy lifestyle. Emergency medical services are available 24/7, ensuring immediate attention and care. Additionally, mental health support, counselling services, and rehabilitation programs are integrated into the policy to address holistic health needs, emphasizing physical, emotional, and psychological well-being (<u>View Document</u>).





The institution has adequate facilities to support physical and recreational requirements of students and staff

University has a 200-acre green campus, emphasizing eco-friendliness and energy efficiency. The University focuses on fostering physical fitness, mental and emotional well-being, and cultural enrichment among its students, faculty members, and staff. In order to ensure that students, faculty members and staff maintain their physical fitness, the University provides Gym facilities with 1 indoor gym with 125 sq. m. covered area and 1 outdoor gym with 235 sq.m. covered area.

Yoga facility

The Yoga Centre conducts regular sessions & training programs on yoga asanas, pranayama, meditation & stress management for students, faculty & staff for maintenance and enhancement of their overall well-being. Workshops like the "Science of Joyful Living" based on the teachings of Swami Rama, aiming to unlock hidden potential and promote joy, creativity, and dynamism are also organized periodically. In accordance with the teachings of Swami Rama and the ancient Indian gurus, the Himalayan School of Yoga Sciences was founded with the goal of providing instruction in cutting-edge fields of yoga science and holistic health as well as strong moral standards. Our yoga school's primary goal is to establish the department as a Centre of Excellence and provide top-notch instruction that satisfies the demands of the modern educational and medical fields. At SRHU, yoga science interacts with various related fields of study.





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Health Care Research

The University is committed to advancing health care through robust research initiatives aimed at addressing contemporary health challenges. It actively fosters interdisciplinary research in fields such as biotechnology, pharmacology, clinical sciences, and public health. Research projects both Intramural research grants and extramural research grants are focused on the development of innovative therapies, drug discovery, disease diagnostics, epidemiological studies, and health intervention strategies. The University collaborates with national and international institutions, industries, and funding agencies to conduct cutting-edge research that translates scientific discoveries into practical healthcare solutions. In accordance with the vision of the university, all Schools are conducting quality research. Out of all Schools, Himalayan Institute of Medical Sciences, Himalayan School of Biosciences and Himalayan School of Yoga Sciences focuses on the health care research.

Collaborations

The University actively fosters collaborations with national and international institutions, industries, and research organizations to enhance healthcare research and training. These partnerships facilitate the exchange of knowledge, technology, and best practices, driving advancements in medical research and improving healthcare delivery systems. Collaborative





initiatives include joint research projects, student and faculty exchange programs, training workshops, and seminars. Strategic alliances with government agencies and non-governmental organizations further support outreach programs, public health campaigns, and skill development activities. Through these collaborative efforts, the University reinforces its commitment to achieving SDG 3 by leveraging collective expertise and resources to promote health and well-being globally.

Research Projects

The University provides research funds to promote the research for conduction of research (<u>Intramural-Projects-Completed-2022.pdf</u>, <u>Intramural-Projects-Completed-2023.pdf</u>). To name a few intramural projects funded by the university are:

- 1. Prospective observational study of gastric emptying time in newborns and comparison of gastric emptying time in between appropriate for gestational age and small for gestational age newborns.
- 2. Assessment of Health Problems among Brick Kiln Factory Workers in a District of Uttar Pradesh -A Cross-Sectional Study.
- 3. Bio Social Risk Factors of Acute Stroke: A Case Control study from tertiary care Hospital of Uttarakhand.
- 4. A cross-sectional study evaluating the knowledge, practices and attitudes of the general population on antibiotic use.
- 5. A Smart System or Non-Invasively Determining Level of Bilirubin, Haemoglobin and Haematocrit in Blood Using Artificial Intelligence.
- 6. First Aid and Support Training Manual for Drivers and Conductors.

The University has successfully undertaken several extramural projects funded by national and international agencies to advance healthcare research and innovation. These projects focus on critical health issues such as cancer diagnostics, infectious diseases, metabolic disorders, and regenerative medicine. Through collaborations with organizations like the Department of Biotechnology (DBT), Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), and State funding agencies, the University has been able to address key healthcare challenges.

Extramural funding has supported the establishment of advanced research facilities, development of novel therapeutic approaches, and implementation of community-based interventions. These projects also emphasize capacity building, training programs, and





translational research to ensure practical applicability and scalability of outcomes. By leveraging extramural grants, the University continues to make meaningful contributions to achieving SDG 3 and improving public health (Extramural-Project-Completed-2022.pdf, Extramural-Project-Ongoing-2022-.pdf). - 5. Establishing a regional rare blood donor registry in Uttarakhand.
- 6. Resistance to Anti-Leprosy Drugs in Multi-Bacillary Leprosy Patients: A prospective Observation study from Tertiary Care Health Institute in Uttarakhand.

Research Publications

Faculty members and researchers regularly publish peer-reviewed articles, review papers, and case studies focusing on diverse areas such as clinical sciences, biotechnology, pharmacology, and public health. Disease Prevention and Health Education

The University places a strong emphasis on disease prevention and health education as fundamental components of promoting public health and well-being. It conducts awareness programs, vaccination drives, health screening camps, and nutrition education sessions to address preventive healthcare needs. Special outreach programs focus on maternal and child health, infectious disease prevention, hygiene practices, and lifestyle modifications to reduce the risk of chronic diseases.

Health education initiatives are designed to empower individuals and communities with the knowledge and skills needed to make informed decisions about their health. The University also engages in capacity-building activities for healthcare workers and volunteers, ensuring they are equipped to deliver effective health interventions. By integrating prevention-focused education with community participation, the University strengthens efforts to create healthier and more resilient societies.

The University offers a basket of core courses, electives, skill/capability enhancement courses, value addition courses, and inter-disciplinary courses in keeping with the recent advances in respective disciplines, as relevant to the programs. The curricula take into consideration the needs of environmental sustainability, community health programs, global health care issues, diseases of epidemic & pandemic potential, international health regulations, impact of climate change, mental health issues, Covid-19, occupational diseases, along with national issues like poverty, safe water, rising burden of NCDs, population explosion, gender empowerment,





inadequate health infrastructure, malnutrition, tuberculosis elimination, etc, as also highlighted in the UN's 'Sustainable Development Goals' (<u>Read more</u>).


