INTRODUCTION

Swami Rama Himalayan University (SRHU) was established under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956 through the Swami Rama Himalayan University Act, 2012 and is promoted by the Himalayan Institute Hospital Trust (HIHT), a registered society under the Societies Registration Act, 1860. Rooted in the humanitarian philosophy of its founder, H.H. Dr. Swami Rama, the University is committed to delivering quality education, compassionate healthcare, and research-driven innovation, and has emerged as a leading multidisciplinary institution in northern India. In 2024, SRHU was awarded an A+ Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), reflecting its academic excellence and institutional.

The Placement Cell at Swami Rama Himalayan University has been instrumental in strengthening industry linkages and enhancing employability skills among students across programs. Over the past few years, SRHU has witnessed a steady and encouraging upward trend in placements, reflecting the quality of education, skilling and preparedness of its graduates. Each year more companies participate in campus recruitment drives, expanding opportunities for students across different disciplines such as Healthcare and Life sciences, IT, Management, Engineering, and others. The percentage of students securing placements has consistently improved year-on-year, demonstrating stronger industry acceptance and effective career support initiatives.

SURVEY OVERVIEW

Swami Rama Himalayan University (SRHU) conducted the Employment Survey 2024–25 among its graduates of the academic session 2023–24 to assess employability outcomes, progression to higher education, career readiness, and the relevance of academic programs to industry requirements. The survey also aimed to evaluate the effectiveness of institutional career support systems and to identify dominant employment sectors for SRHU graduates. The survey was administered through an online questionnaire circulated via official email IDs, alumni networks, and departmental social media groups. The collected data has been analyzed and presented in this report for academic quality enhancement, accreditation, and strategic planning purposes. Following table provides the survey summary:



EMPLOYMENT STATUS OF GRADUATES

The employment survey reveals strong employability outcomes for SRHU graduates, with a significant proportion securing employment within six months of graduation, while others have opted for higher education.


The employability rate of 65.30% reflects the university's strong focus on industry-oriented curriculum, practical exposure, and structured career guidance. The remaining 34.7% graduates pursuing higher studies indicate a healthy inclination towards academic advancement and research.




The dominance of the Healthcare industry demonstrates the university's alignment with regional and national healthcare needs, supported by strong hospital-based training and clinical exposure.




Nearly 65% of graduates earn above ₹5,00,000 annually, reflecting strong industry demand and competitive compensation. The majority fall in the ₹5,00,000–₹10,00,000 range, making it the most common salary bracket.



Employment opportunities generated through institutional recruitment, industry partnerships, internships, and alumni networks, supporting graduates in securing relevant career placements are summarized below:


